## HANDWRITING COMPETITION (21-FEB-2026)



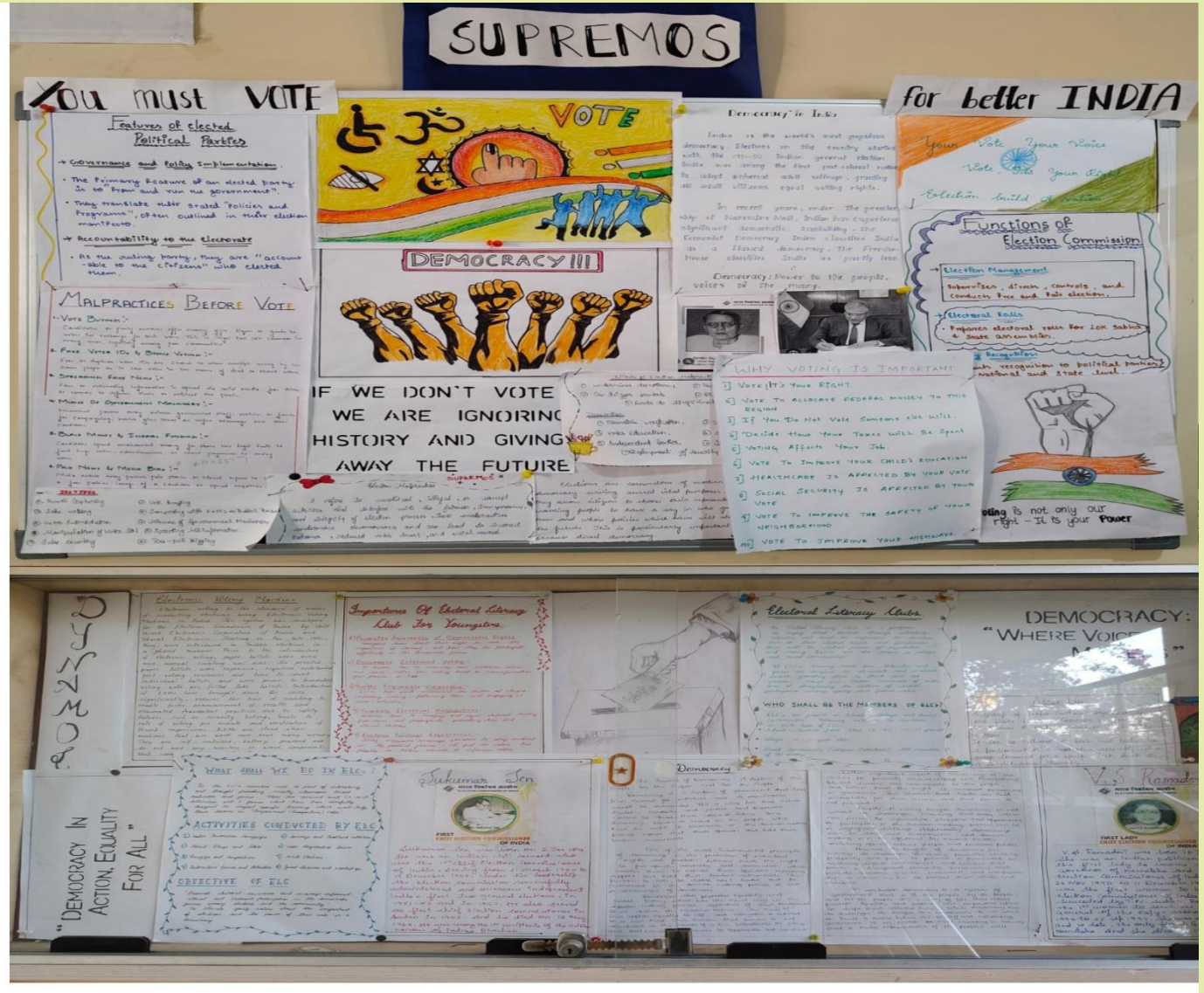
All the students from 2nd to 7th Standard enthusiastically participated in the Handwriting Competition held on 21st February.

# ELC SOFT BOARD COMPETITION(24-FEB-2026)

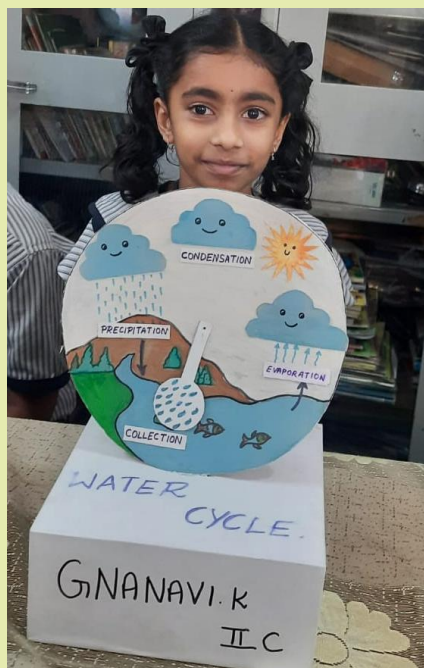

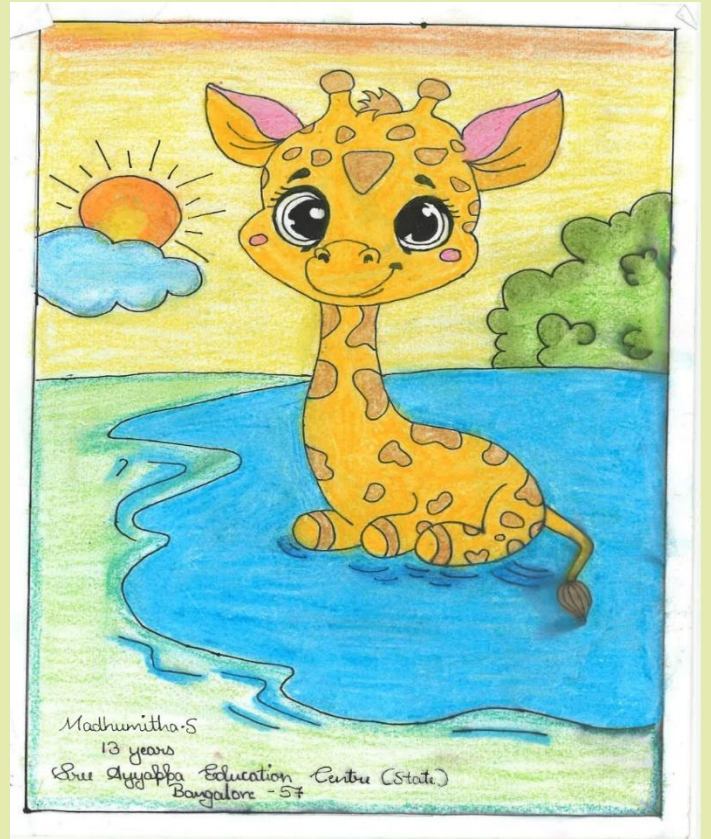

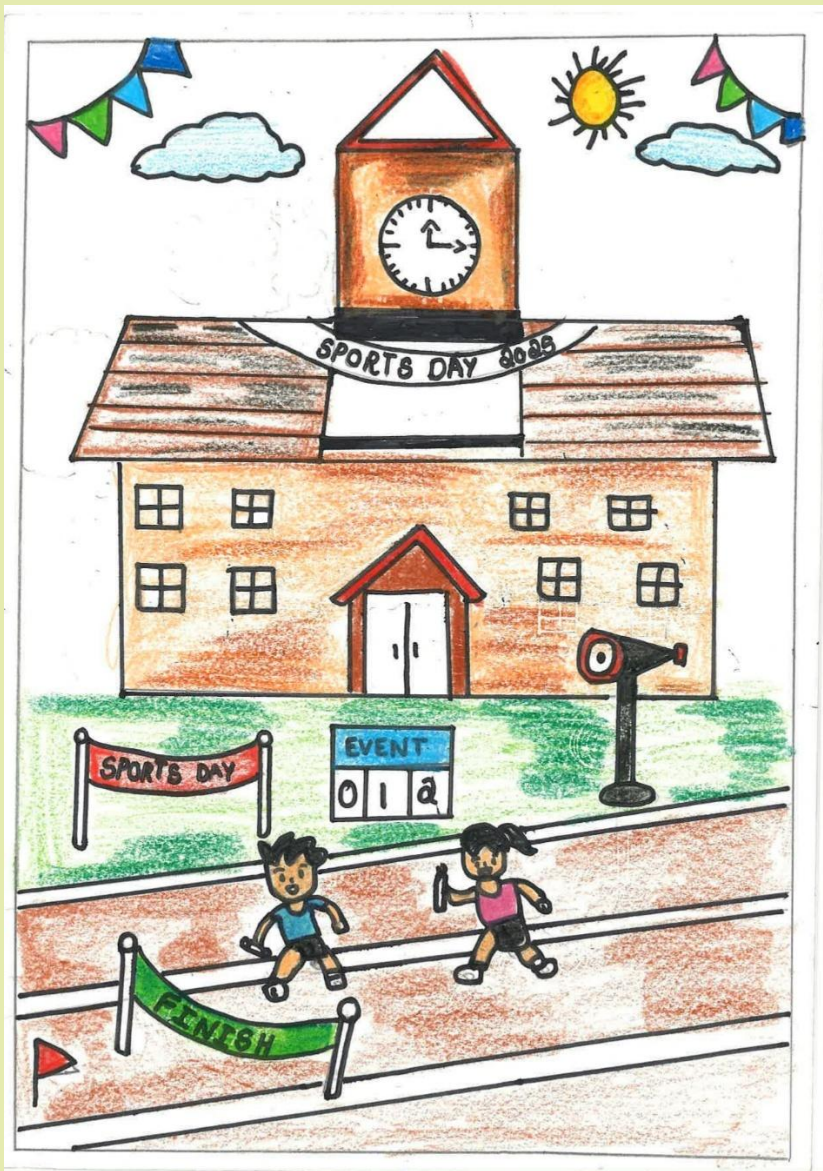
